Dear HPPC Family,

They have brought so much joy to my life as they show affection for us and each other, they purr loudly, curl up for a cuddle and make us laugh with their curiosity and antics. I know this is an animal-loving congregation, so I know most (if not all) of you will understand as I use them as examples of how I see God in my life.

I am a member of a group on Facebook called Clergy with Cats. It is an international group with people from all over the world that serve in every denomination of church, synagogue, mosque, and more. There are around 3,000 of us in all. It is a glimpse into the kingdom of God on a platform that is not always known to spread love, cheer, and goodwill.



Clergy will post a photo of their beloved cat and often write the message from their cat's perspective giving insight and updates about what is

happening in their life (and their human's lives)...asking for prayer or encouragement or inviting others to join in celebrating with them. The responses are so loving and kind, and it is so refreshing to see people connect on something as simple as the love of their cats. I recently posted some photos of Murphy and Milo and one fellow clergy person commented, "Thank you for sharing these precious photos. They were a bright spot in my day." It was a good reminder that it doesn't take much to bring joy and a smile to others.

In Paul's letter to the church in Thessalonica, he writes "And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone." (1 Thessalonians 5:14) I feel like we are still trying to figure out what it looks like to be people of faith in the world in 2023. In some ways, I think Clergy with Cats has figured some of this out. It is guided by love and it provides a safe space for folks to give and receive care, support, encouragement, and celebration.

As we head into these long summer days of extreme heat, I felt like it was a good reminder to look for the glimpses of God's presence around us. Look for ways to ease the burden of your neighbors and do what it takes to bring a smile to someone else's face. Cherish your cats...or dogs...or grandkids...or gardens...or whatever helps you see God is there. And when you can, share that joy with others. Joy is meant to be shared.

My prayer is that your life overflows with these glimpses of God's love and joy today and always.

It is my hope that each month, the additional content provides entertainment, informative information about new members of the congregation, and laughter.


