To support these family members, they depend on scholarships of \$120 per student which pays school fees, school supplies, food while at school, and uniforms for an entire year! You do not have to give \$120 to participate. You can give whatever you are able and together we combine our gifts to support scholarships for these beloved children of God on the other side of the world. 




Friendship Part I







