Dear HPPC Family,

I don't know about you, but this sounds pretty good! What do we as individuals and as a church family need to work on to know and feel that we are flourishing?

Psalm 92:12-15 -

- ¹³ They are planted in the house of the LORD; they flourish in the courts of our God.
- In old age they still produce fruit; they are always green and full of sap,
- showing that the LORD is upright; he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

My prayer for our church is that we grow in a healthy and vigorous way. I pray that we depend fully on God, who is our rock. I pray we continue to work together and nurture our community as a church family. I pray we produce fruit that is full of life and potential!

Information about Lent



This year, the Lenten Season begins on February 14th and ends on Easter Day. It is a time to focus on our discipleship and remember God is immersed in our everyday lives.

Many people relate Lent with giving up an indulgence such as chocolate or social media. Doing so seems to be a demonstration of discipline and commitment to faith. A different (and perhaps better) option is to add something you may not do regularly that draws you closer to God as Jesus draws nearer to the cross.

Additions can be choosing to devote time each day to support the community, serving others, appreciating nature, or spending time in prayer.

If you choose to do a combination of the two, i.e. give up chocolate, you can refrain from eating it but keep it on hand and give it to others instead.

- Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- Fast from worries and trust in God.

- Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.
- Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
- Fast from words and be silent so you can listen."
